(PESI) hereby acknowledges its obligations under the Law and certifies that it is in compliance with the Law and all obligations required therein. The [COMPANY] agrees to continue to comply with all requirements of the Law during the term of the Contract.

Furthermore, the Professional Educational Services, Inc. (PESI) shall indemnify, defend, and hold, the Board and its respective officers, employees, servants, agents, assigns and affiliates ("Indemnified Parties"), harmless from and against, any and all suits, actions, liabilities, losses, claims, damages, and expenses including, without limitation, costs of investigation and defense (including costs of private investigation and surveillance), costs for medical treatment, expert witness fees, legal fees (e.g., fees of attorneys, paralegals and other legal professionals for the defense of the underlying suits, etc.), expenses and diminution of value, whether or not involving a third party claim, arising out of or in any manner connected with the Company's compliance with, or lack thereof, its obligations under the Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:6-7.6 to 7.13, to be provided for the Indemnified Parties, including, but not limited to, services performed under this Agreement and Addendum, or any such other work performed for the Indemnified Parties, in any way related to the acts or omissions of the Company, its agents, servants, employees, Subcontractors, subconsultants, anyone directly or indirectly employed by them or anyone for whose acts or omissions they may be legally liable ("Covered Parties") to the extent that such suits, actions, liabilities, losses, claims, damages and expenses are caused by the Covered Parties. If in a given case a court rules that the Company is not negligent and/or did not breach its statutory duty, then the Company no longer has an obligation to defend and indemnify the Board in such case.
